Three out of four swimmers must work for the industry and the name of the industry must appear on the entry form.

At least three immediate family and one relation.

The Harry Bates Cup

Awarded to the fastest time of the night.

The Burgess Family Sports Trophy

Awarded to the winning sports team (last to be eliminated).

All four swimmers must attend the same school.

After a spate of vehicle burglary's and vandalism in the community, an article was included in the 2019 August newsletter about installing a CCTV security camera. Residents were asked for feedback either by direct

contact with the Association or via Facebook. It appeared to be a popular decision and the PKBA went ahead and organised for the installation of a camera. They have worked with council staff and local police and decided the best position was at the roundabout. Since installation there have been concerns that the camera is not installed in the correct place and should not be facing the roundabout. Logic seems to suggest that to capture 'escapee's with stolen vehicles from both beaches, this was the best position. The live feed and data storage will be kept at the Kaiapoi Police Station and the Association have been assured it will only be used in the case of a theft.

Thanks must go to both the PKBA and also to the Pines/Kairaki Volunteer Rural Fire Force for their foresight. Because they could see the value of placing a camera in the area your local fire brigade contributed financially towards the installation.

Council staff are beginning consultation on the Pines Beach entrance project as part of the Red Zone recovery plan and District Regeneration project and will include upcoming community engagement /consultation with the stakeholder group and wider community. While the area is well defined, it would be useful to look at the overall landscape at The Pines Beach Entrance, in terms of function, amenity and aesthetic. The Recovery Plan includes a broad outline for the development; opportunities for a more attractive entrance, paths, seating and environmental enhancement.

<u>Please note</u>:- While the red outline crosses over a private property, this will NOT be included in any discussion or be included in the plan. Green recreational & ecological space only.

If you have good ideas for this area let your local PKBA know now. E.g. picnic area, lots of trees planted, seating areas, picnic tables or perhaps you don't think it needs anything more—just a tidy up.
